The Parliamentary Gazetteer of Ireland 1846 **New September 09** 28.00

Product Description

The Parliamentary Gazetteer of Ireland was published in 1846 and remains the only parliamentary gazetteer that covers the thirty-two counties of Ireland. Extending to more than 2,000 pages it covers every significant Placename in Ireland with extensive social and statistical information at the outset of the famine.

Bateman's Great Landowners of Great Britain and Ireland **New September 09** 17.00

Product Description

Published the fourth edition of his The Great Landowners of Great Britain and Ireland, A list of all owners of Three thousand acres and upwards, worth £3,000 a year; Also, one thousand three hundred owners of Two thousand acres and upwards, in England, Scotland, Ireland, & Wales, their acreage and income from Land, Culled from 'THE MODERN DOMESDAY BOOK', in 1883, under the Harrison imprint. It first appeared in 1876 as The Acre-Ocracy of England

A Topographical Dictionary of Ireland: Including Lewis's Atlas of Ireland **New September 09** 28.00

Product Description

Lewis's Topographical Dictionary of Ireland is the first detailed study of its kind for Ireland. It was published in 1837, before the Famine (1845-50), so it is very important for historians and genealogists of the early nineteenth century.

Taylor and Skinner's Road Maps of Ireland (2nd Ed., 1783) **New September 09** 17.00

Product Description

This remarkable and exceptionally rare publication was the second and corrected edition of the first road map of Ireland. Originally published in 1778, the authors felt it necessary to reissue the title quickly to correct deficiencies. The maps were commissioned by the House of Commons in Ireland, and contain 289 pages of maps. The index for these detailed maps shows distances in English and Irish miles. The maps themselves show copious topographical details, like forests, hills, farm land, mills, houses, churches, etc. The large houses also give the owners names. There is a personal name index at the back detailing every name recorded on the maps. This edition also contains a new large-scale 'accurate' map of Ireland.

Taylor and Skinner's road maps of Ireland (and their books for Scotland, England and the USA) were a phenomenal achievement for their day, and remains an essential research tool for the late eighteenth century

Sir Arthur Vicars, Index to the Prerogative Wills of Ireland, 1536-1810 **New September 09** 17.00

Product Description

This important book is well known to Irish genealogists. It contains an index to over 40,000 Irish wills, most of which were destroyed in the 1922 explosion at the Public Record Office in Dublin.

Rev. Woulfe, Sloinnte Gaedheal Is Gall: Irish Names and Surnames (1923) **New September 09** 10.00

Product Description

This important book was the result of 25 years of tireless research by Rev. Woulfe throughout Ireland and in England and Scotland. In it he gathers together the overwhelming majority of Irish forenames and surnames, together with explanatory notes and some history. Most importantly he explains the meanings and origins of Irish first names and surnames, as well as showing their Irish and/or English translations

Consumer Protection (Distance Selling) Regulations 2000 Conditions of Sale

"Distance Selling" means all sales of goods and the provision of services other than face to face including transactions using the Internet, by mail order, telephone, fax and advertising in magazines, newspapers and periodicals;

A customer has the right to cancel an order for goods within 7 working days of receipt of the goods. This 7 day "cooling off" period excludes Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Notification of intention to cancel should be received by the Society within the cooling off period, in writing.

"Writing" includes letter, fax and e-mail sent to the Society at its nominated address. A telephone call will not be acceptable.

On receipt of due notice, within the cooling off period, the Society will refund the retail sale price of the goods if, but only if, they are returned in a re-saleable condition. The goods are to be cared for by the customer at the customer's risk.

The cost of returning the goods must be paid for by the customer and will not be paid by the Society.

Payment of a refund will be made within 30 days of receipt of the returned goods in a re-saleable condition by the Society. Refunds will be made by cheque or recrediting the customer's credit card if the original purchase order was made using a credit card.

No refunds will be made in respect of CD-ROM's where the customer has broken open the seal or wrapper.

If the Society has been asked to supply a service, for a fee, then once the request and fee for the service have been received by the Society, it will start to process the request and "no cooling off" period shall apply, with the consequence that no refund of fee shall be made even if the customer wishes to stop the research.

The laws of England and Wales shall apply to this contract.
